## Find out your ring size

This is how it works
There are two ways to determine your ring size:
Option I: If you fold the paper along the dotted line, you can cut out the semicircle along the outer line. Now it is easy to check which circle fits your finger and voilà, you know your ring size. Make sure the round circle fits the finger, which is supposed to carry the ring, tightly. There may even be a light tension when moving the cut-out over the knuckle.
Option 2: Put one of your rings on the circles on the paper and choose the right size by making sure that the outer line of the circles is visible inside the ring.

Explanation of numbers
The number in the circle corresponds to the inner diameter in millimetres. The numbers below the circle correspond to the ring size, hence the order size: first number = German ring size // second number = Italian ring size.

$\mathrm{S}=50-53 \quad \mathrm{M}=54-57 \quad \mathrm{~L}=58-6 \mathrm{I}$
